ROBERT LOUIS STEVENSON

"TUSITALA . . . TELLER OF TALES"

ON November 13, 1850, in Edinburgh, Scotland, Robert Louis Stevenson was born. The child was weakly and ailing and no one gave him much of a chance to live; much less to become the great spinner of romance and adventure stories that the world has since applauded. Had not his family been able to watch over his sickly health and take him to the places doctors recommended for him, he may never have reached manhood. So, from his earliest days, young Stevenson spent very little time in any one locale.

His father, grandfather, and uncle were all celebrated builders of lighthouses. With such an ancestry and a pride in the family occupation, it was quite natural that Stevenson was intrigued and in love with the sea.

At school, because of his inability to participate in physical activities, Stevenson turned his mind and efforts to the world of literature. He enjoyed copying the styles of his favorite authors, and started developing the manner in which he, too, relates, so vividly, his highly spirited stories. At sixteen, his first published works appeared, a story of an historical event, "The Portland Ring."

Combining his frequent travels in the search of better health with his love for adventure and writing, he turned out a series of essays and novels of adventure and travel. His first books, "An Inland Voyage" and "Travel with a Donkey in the Cévennes" were short stories of travel on the Continent of Europe.

His name as an author didn't become too popular until his next book, "Treasure Island", appeared. This marvellous story of piracy and buried treasures proclaimed his talents to the world, and in the years that followed, his complete works required twenty-eight volumes to contain.

Soon followed "Kidnapped", "Doctor Jekyll and Mr. Hyde", "The Black Arrow", and "The Master of Ballantrae"; all complete and thrilling novels.



He did not confine himself to prose, however, but wrote many fine verses especially for children. His anthology, "A Child's Garden of Verses", published in 1885, is one of the finest collections of children's poetry ever assembled.

Finding that European climate did not suit his health, he travelled to America and eventually set up home in California. Here, in the United States, he fell in love with an American girl and married.

At the age of thirty-nine, he could no longer fight the severity of the northern winters, and with his wife and two step-children left for the Samoan Island in the Pacific Ocean. There, on this beautiful tropical island, he continued writing his beloved stories and verse.

The Samoan natives learned to love the man, Robert Louis Stevenson, and the stories that flowed from his restless pen. They named him "Tusitala", meaning the teller of tales, and treated him and his family as if they were gods.

Spring in his home, he would often spend hours looking at the majestic Mount Vesuvius peering high above the island below it. On December 3, 1894, he suddenly died. Sixty husky Samoan natives carried his corpse up the mountain, cutting the brush aside as they proceeded upwards with the coffin. There, on its highest peak, lay his body forever more. No guns are allowed in this area, so that "the birds may live there undisturbed and raise above his grave the songs he loved so well".



PIONEERS OF SCIENCE

JOSEPH PRIESTLEY

"The Father of Soda Water and Discoverer of Oxygen"

THE pious parishioners in Leeds, England during the eighteenth century, were all disturbed by the rumors circulating that their new minister, Joseph Priestley, was frequently a nightly visitor at the brewery near his house. What could he possibly be doing there, they asked. The mystery grew and grew. It still was not understood, when one of the brewery workers explained to a prying neighbor:

"All 'e does is 'old a chip o' wood in 'is 'ard, and a candle in the other, 'E lights the chip, 'e does, and 'e 'olds it over the vat. When the flames goes out, 'e lights it again and starts all over. With no disrespect, send you, there's those of us who thanks 'is 'abney!"

In his home, Priestley explained his observations to his wife. "It's a strange gas", he said, "which is found near the surface of the fermenting vat. The candle flame is immediately extinguished by it."

This new gas was carbon dioxide. When Priestley moved, he found it inconvenient to return continually to the brewery, so he inverted the pneumatic trough. This invention enabled him to collect quantities of his "strange, new air".

By mixing carbon dioxide with water, he found that the result was a pleasant tasting drink. This was the first "soda water" ever manufactured and the forerunner of today's "soda pop".

Science was Priestley's hobby. He had no previous training for his experiments. As he pointed out, himself:

"I have often thought that this circumstance was no disadvantage to me; as I was led to devise an apparatus and processes of my own, adapted to my peculiar views. Whereas, if I had been previously accustomed to the usual chemical pro-

cesses, I should not thought of any other; and without my new mode of operation, I should hardly have discovered anything materially new."

The preacher-scientist tested himself with a search for new gases. One day, he focused the sun's rays on a deposit of oxide of mercury. Next, he put a lighted candle into the gas and was amazed as it flared up. Priestley then held a red hot wire in the gas and it glared more brightly.

For long months, he wondered about this and began other experiments. Placing mice in vessels containing this new air, he found that its life lasted twice as long. When he tried breathing the new air himself, he found it to be tasteless, odorless, and exhilarating.

"Perhaps", thought Priestley, "my new gas can help people with lung trouble." This experiment, separating oxygen, made on March 8, 1775, was a real lesser day in the history of science. That hope, that oxygen may help lung disorders, has been realized many, many times.

Although honored by the Royal Society with the Copley medal for his scientific discovery, Priestley wanted to be remembered as a clergyman. He wrote: "How insignificant are all subjects compared to those which relate to religion."

The name of Priestley, however, will live as a scientist who has contributed greatly to the comfort and enjoyment of life. The oxygen tent, a modern medical miracle, is due directly to the work of this small town parson, as well as the other many ways in which oxygen is used in commercial and medical devices.

The next time you drink an ice cream soda, lift your glass and toast the man who made it possible—Joseph Priestley.



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
