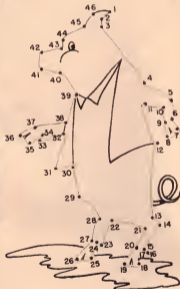

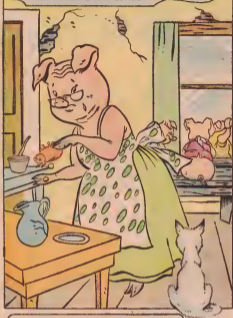

The 3 Little Pigs



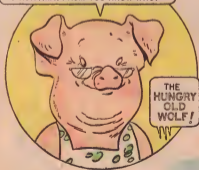

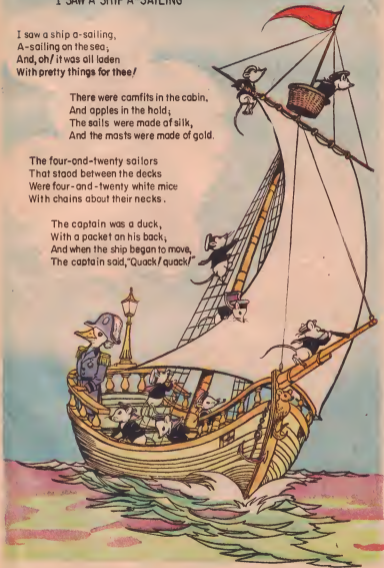
I SAW A SHIP A-SAILING

The captain said, "Quack/ quack!"



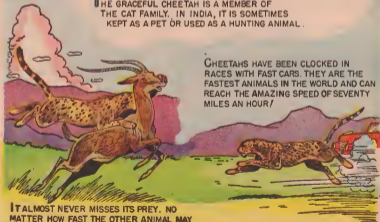
ON A HUNT, THE CHEETAH HAS A HOOD PUT OVER ITS EYES UNTIL GAME IS SIGHTED.



WHEN THE HOOD IS REMOVED, THE CHEETAH INSTANTLY SIGHTS THE GAME AND GOES AFTER IT.



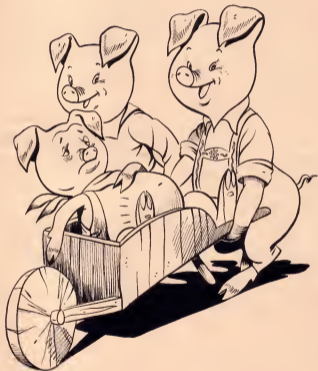
