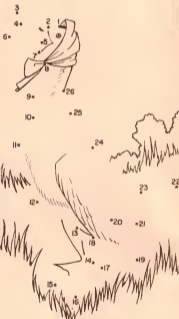

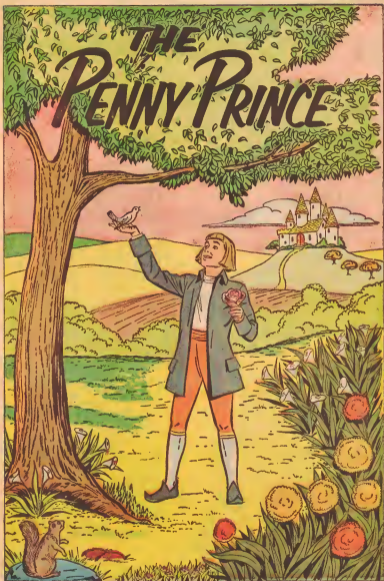

TOO BAD.

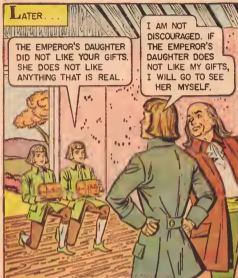

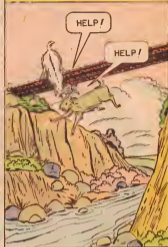

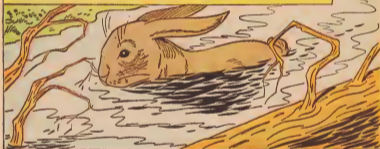

RABBITS WHO LIVE NEAR SWAMPS SOON LEARN TO BE GOOD SWIMMERS.



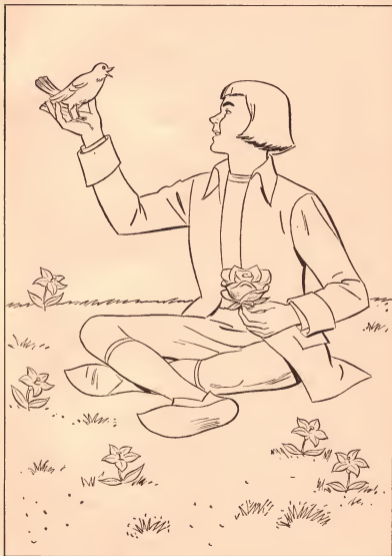
RABBITS WASH THEMSELVES THE SAME WAY CATS DO.
