WHAT IS IT?

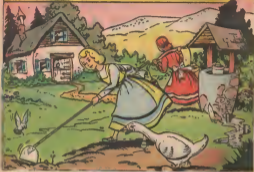

ROSE RED OPENED THE DOOR.





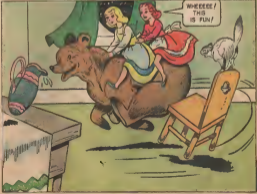
THE GIRLS CLEANED OFF THE SNOW

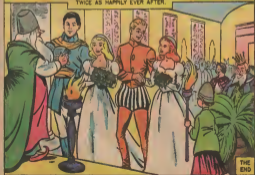
WHEN THE DAY OF THE WEDDING CAME

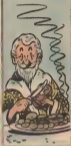


THE SERVANTS BEGAN TO SERVE THE FOOD.
