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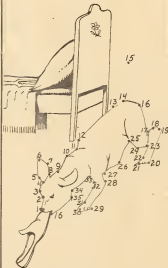
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WHAT IS THIS?

IN THE MIDDLE OF WINTER?



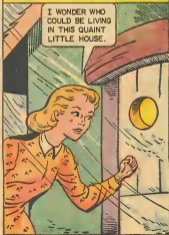

MEANWHILE, DIANE WAS SWEEPING THE SNOW FROM THE DOORSTEP.



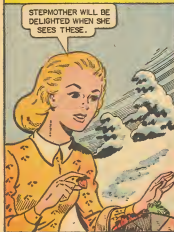

AGATHA WAS HUNGRY, SO SHE TOOK OUT HER SANDWICHES AND CAKE AND BEGAN TO EAT.



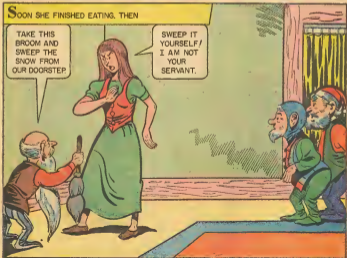
I CERTAINLY WILL NOT GIVE YOU ANY! THERE'S HARDLY ENOUGH HERE FOR ME.

ONE COLD WINTER DAY . . .

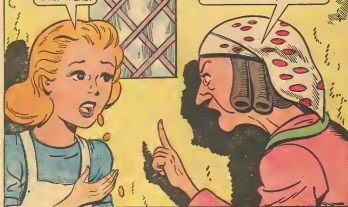
