THEN SHE WOVE RUSHES INTO A SOFT CORD AND TIED IT TO THE NECKLACE.

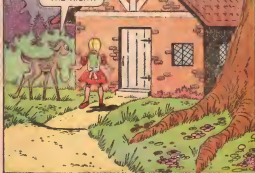


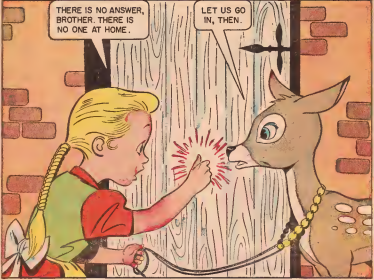

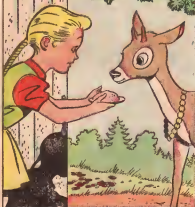

WE SHALL TRY TO FIND HIM, YOUR MAJESTY.



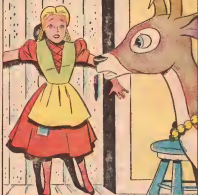

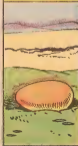
